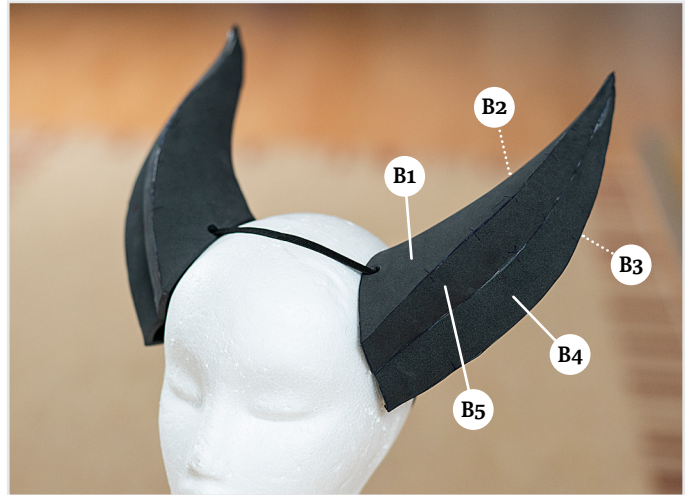

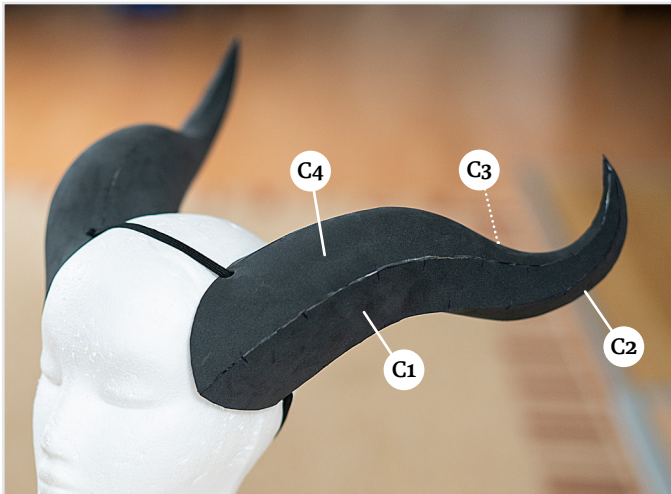

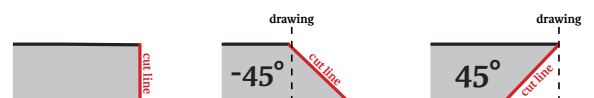


Instructions:

All patterns were made with **5mm low density EVA foam** and glued with **contact cement**.

Rescale the pattern pieces or slim and widen them for new shape variations.

Some pieces are marked with an angle of **45°** or **-45°**. Cut along these angles as shown in this drawing:



How to scale and print these patterns

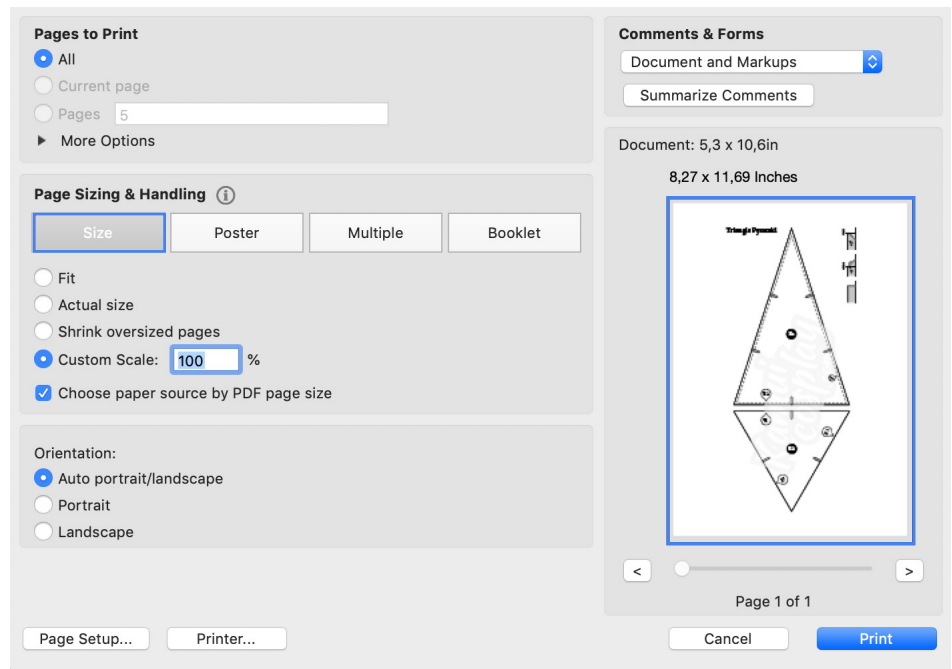
How to print:

To properly scale and print these pattern I recommend using the free [Adobe Acrobat Reader](#).

Now open the pattern collection and select **file -> print** to see the printing options.

Here you can click on **“Actual Size”** and print them at **100%**.

You can also click on **“Custom Scale”** and scale them up or down as you see fit. To the right you will see a preview of your print page.



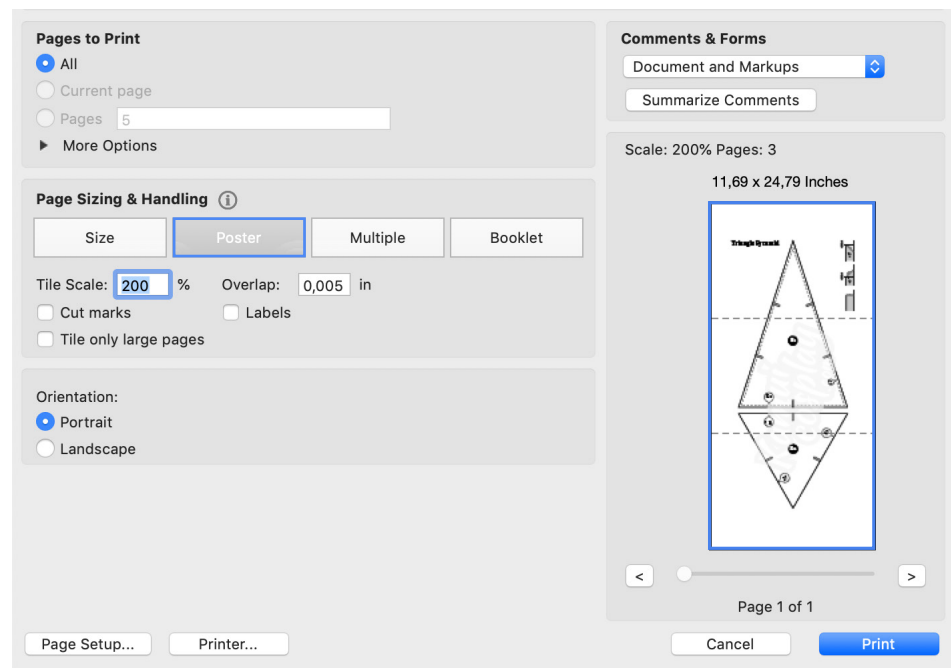
Over multiple pages:

If you set your scale too large you can see that your image would be cut off.

Instead select **“Poster Print”**.

Here you can set your **“Scale”** as large as you need and Acrobat will automatically split them over multiple printing pages.

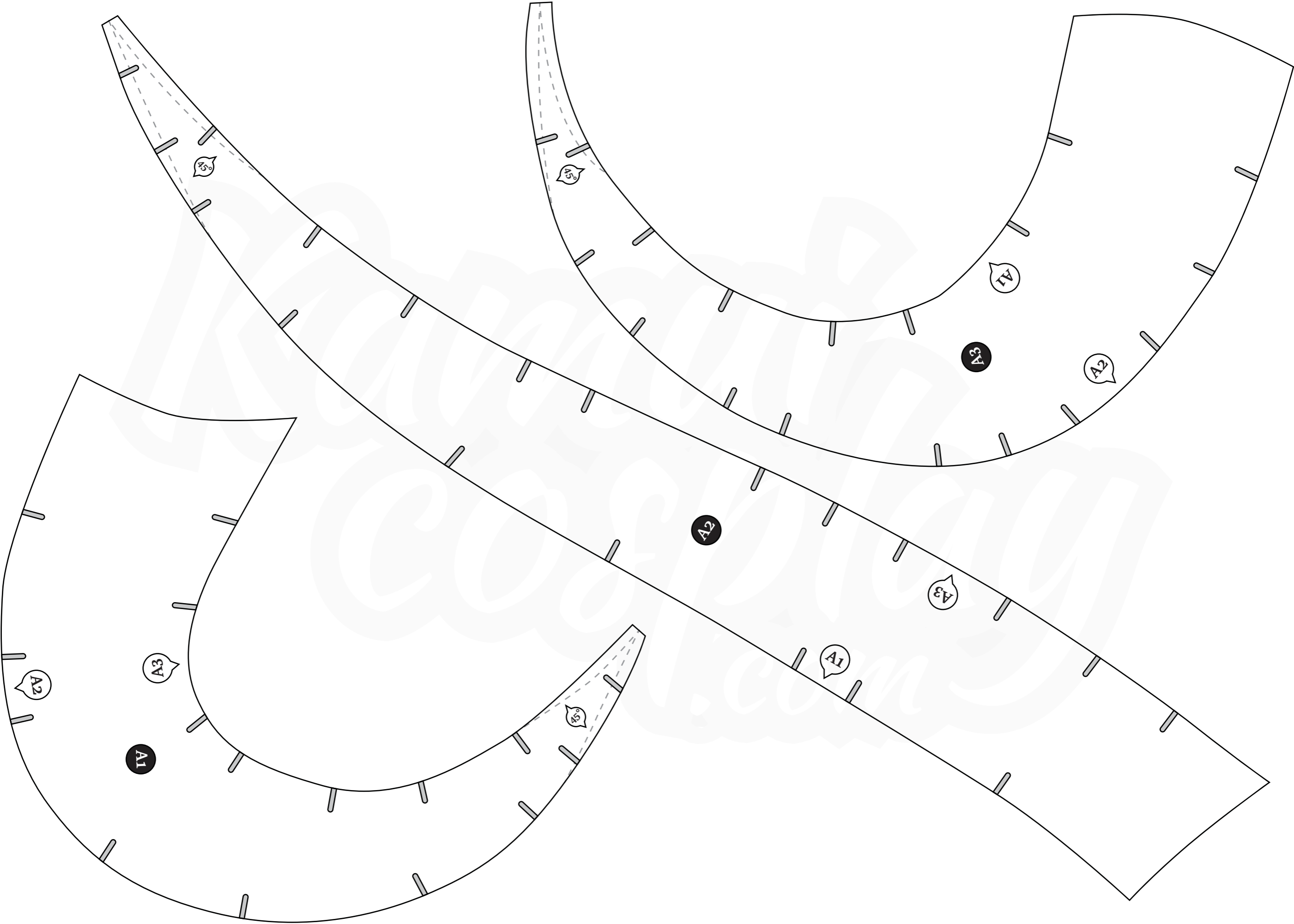
Now you can easily print them out and tape them together.



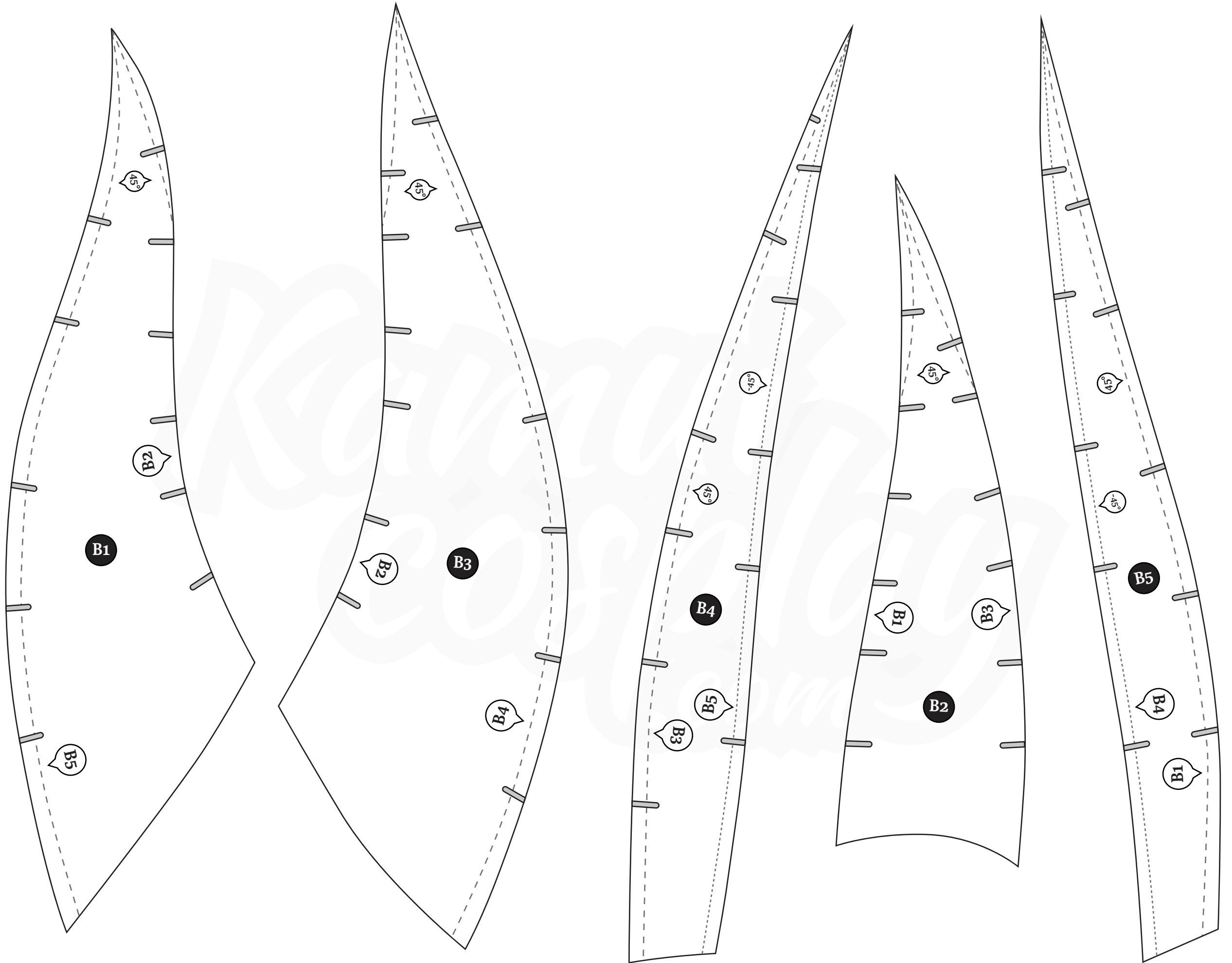
You will find scaling factors and the resulting heights on each individual shape page.

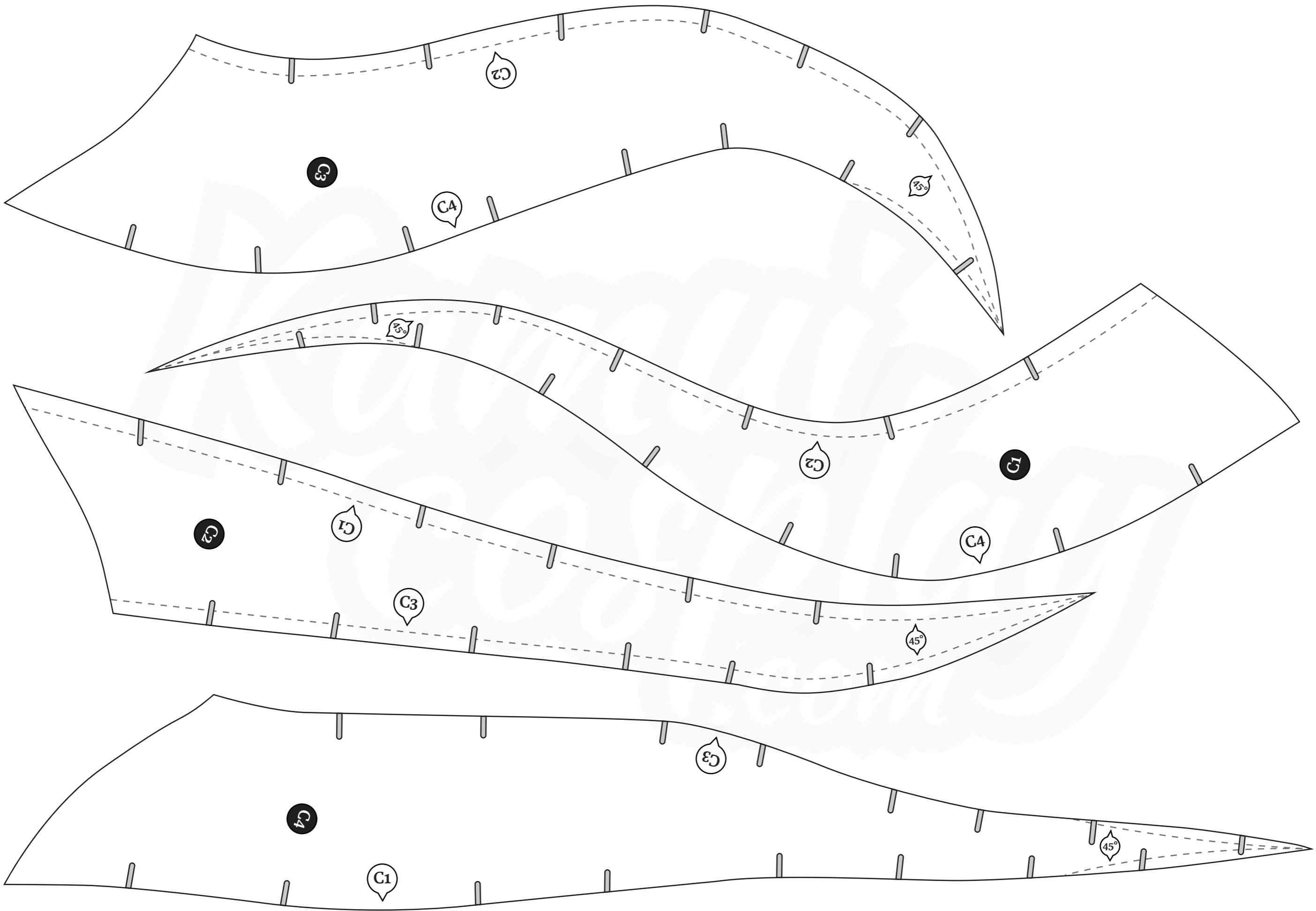

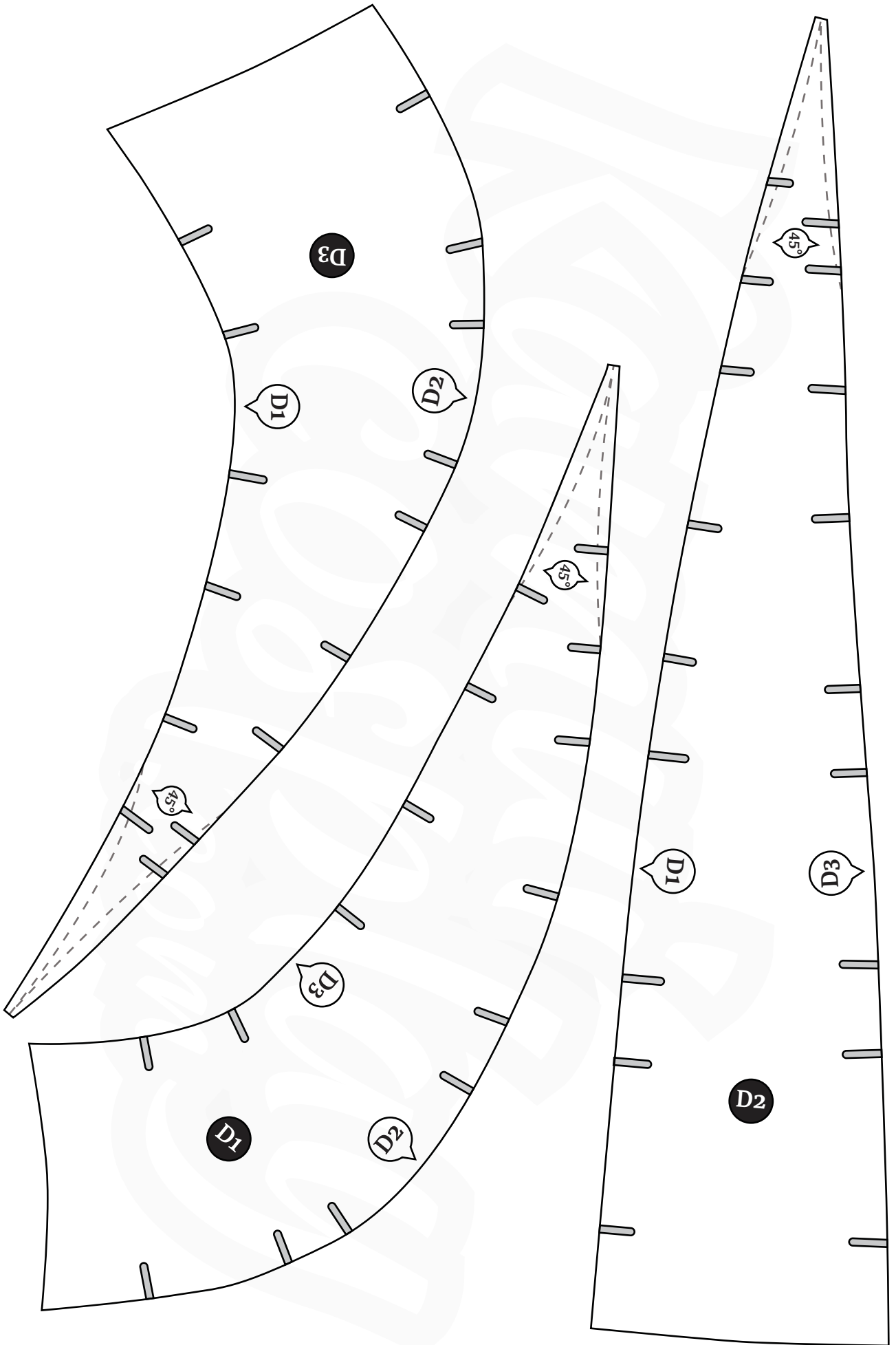
Thick Horns



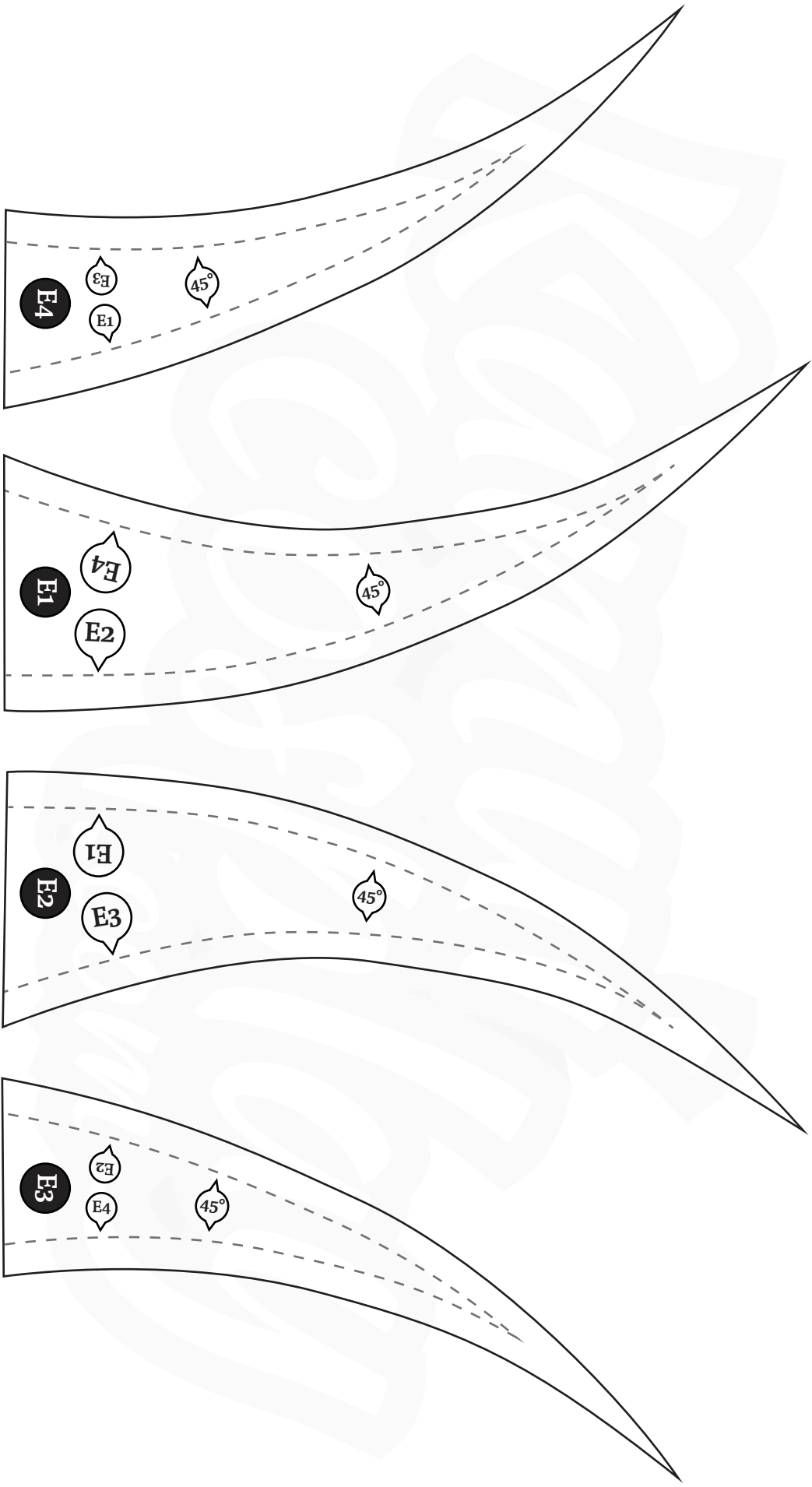
Long Horns
